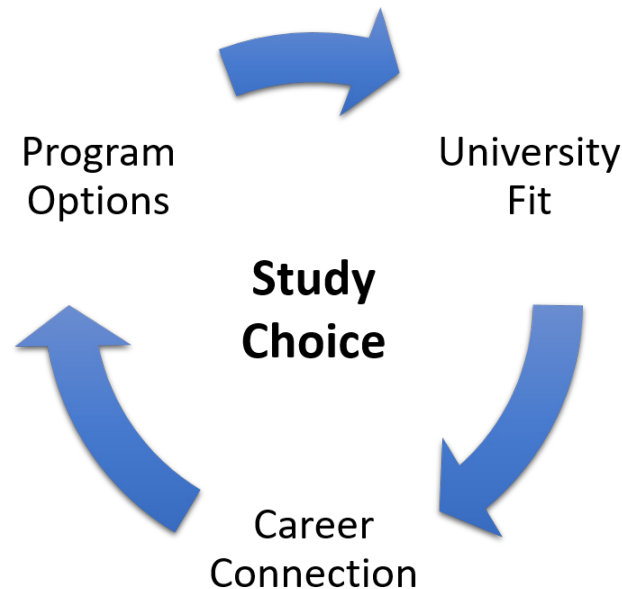




Deciding what to Study at University?

How do I find out more?

Before you finalise your preferences, look at:

- Degree details on the university's webpage
- Course structure or study plan
- What courses/subjects you will study each year, each semester
- Click on each course/subject and look at each description
- Career opportunities connected to the degree
- Campus location, features, support and reputation of the program

Ask a university

University staff can answer any questions you may have. They can help:

- Sort through the application process and entry requirements
- Explain the degree details noted above
- Arrange a visit to the campus you want to attend
- Connect you with a uni student enrolled in your top preferences
- Connect you with a university lecturer who teaches in your top preferences
